Getting to Know Me

2. Beginning the series on Jesus as Prophet, Priest, and King, which of the three offices is most familiar? Which do you most commonly/least commonly associate with Jesus?

Digging Deeper

3. What stood out to you in the sermon on Sunday?
4. Pastor Phil noted that *Christ* is not Jesus' last name. It's the Greek translation of the Hebrew *Messiah* — the *Anointed One*. New to you? If so, what changes?
5. Prophets did much more than just predict the future. How do you see each of these in Jesus?
 - Confronting injustice
 - Confirming God's power
 - Communicating truth
 - Conveying God's character
6. Read Hebrews 1:1-3 and how the writer describes Jesus. What's the difference between a messenger and the message itself?

7. Read John 1:1 & 14. What changes in your understanding of Jesus when you see him not just as someone who speaks for God but as God's Word (*logos*) in human flesh?
8. Jesus performed miracles that deliberately echoed the prophet Elisha. What was Jesus demonstrating through such powerful parallels?
9. Rabbis quoted Scripture or tradition to back up their teaching. Jesus — on the other hand — said, "*You have heard it said...but I say to you*" (Matthew 5).
 - What does that authority shift tell us about who Jesus believed himself to be?
 - Who do you believe him to be?

Making it Personal

10. Which of Jesus' four prophetic roles do you most need to receive from him right now? Now, be honest: Which are you least open to receiving from him right now?
11. We're surrounded by voices claiming to speak truth. How do you tune your heart to hear Jesus above the noise?
12. Holy Week is one week away. What's one step you can take toward Jesus this week?

Prayer

Close in prayer by answering Jesus' question in Matthew 16:15: "*Who do you say that I am?*"

Read Jesus' question to his disciples in Matthew 16:15: "*But what about you? Who do you say I am?*" Then pray together, expressing your answer to him.
